Anthony Huberman writes:

'Gedi Sibony's work asks us to consider our assumptions about art and the sculptural project'

Included in this exhibition are floor plans, sculptural schematics, dimensions, math homework, observations, lunch orders, lists, maps, and spontaneous thoughts.

As a collection of life routines, experiences, observations and exhibition preparations, these *interactions*, *sensations*, *relations*, *units*, *elements* and *functions* make up the peripheral surroundings of Sibony's sculptural projects.

In these works, a curious spiritual quality is engineered, elevating and dignifying note-taking gestures beyond their original intent. They are organized in this way to tell a story, which equalizes the various uses of paper and pencil that life provides, as a way to quickly record for short-term memory.

Included is a pencil drawing from Sibony's time working on the exhibition *The King and the Corpse*, an observational depiction of a former White Castle prefab structure, whose adjustable facade design allows it to fit just within Greene Naftali's basement space. There is a potency to this work, reminding us of drawing's poignant ability to not only record monumental space but also transfer the feeling of a past sculptural experience.

To witness both the structure and the record (the visible and the peripheral) is important.

This exhibition focuses in on the peripheral, hidden, and undocumented. It is a clear example of Sibony's observations and problem-solving process, which now circulate alongside the visible.
